How Jolie, Ginger and other little poodles survived is beyond me... maybe Fred just knew how much they meant to her - ha!*

*I've shared stories of my mom's friendship with Mrs. Rinny with my own children, passing along the joy, the laughter, and the example of a friendship rooted in deep love and support. As a smart, strong woman, her impact on my life was beautiful and strong and I feel so fortunate to have grown up knowing Mrs. Rinny and her family.*

*We hold Michael, Donna, Cameron, and Shannon close in our hearts, wishing that the many positive memories you carry bring comfort. Though we're miles apart, I felt like we knew you through the wonderful stories she shared with my mom -- and she was as proud when she passed those along to me.*

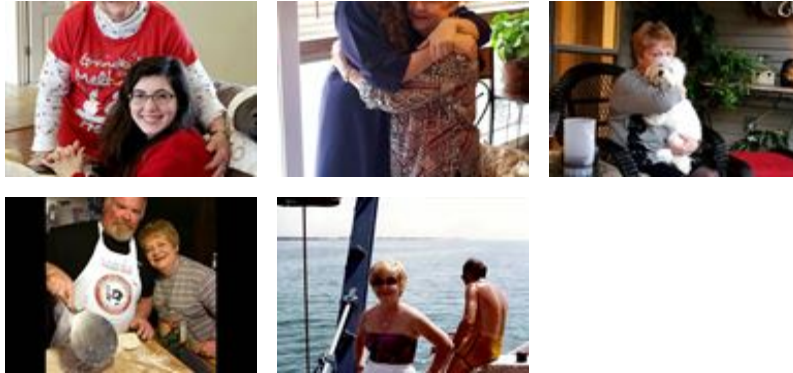
