



Mr. David "Bull" Webb

April 15, 1937 - April 5, 2016

David "Bull" Webb, 78, a beloved Scottsboro and Jackson County native passed away Tuesday, April 5, 2016 as a result of severe burns from an accident on his farm on Old Larkinsville Road. Bull was a 1958 graduate of the old Jackson County High School. His classmates include Pat Trammell, the quarterback of Alabamas 1962 Football National Championship. Pat gave him his name of "Bull" due to his size and strength.

Bull was a freshman with Scottsboro natives Pat Trammell and John Olinger on Bear Bryant's first Alabama team in 1959. Bull had a knee injury that prevented him from playing and his true love was farming. That led him to get his Agriculture Degree from Auburn University in 1963. He was one of Jackson County's most successful farmers and most conversations were about his cows. Bull was an appropriate name as he was strong as an ox. He was a man among men and not just in strength, his word was his bond and he possessed a gentle heart. Both the young and old of Jackson County knew Bull Webb. All speak of his vast knowledge of farming and cattle and he was always willing to share that knowledge and experience to help others Bull would have been 79 years old on April 15.

He is survived by his brother; Charles (Frances) Webb and several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his sisters; Juanita and Linda and a brother; Paul.

Services will be held on Friday, 4-8-16 at 11:00 a.m. from Langston Methodist Church with Rev. Terry Woods officiating. Burial will follow in Langston Cemetery. The family will receive friends on Friday from 10 till 11 a.m. at the church.
