Mr. John "Two Shot" Smith, 72, of Scottsboro, rode to his Heavenly home on Sunday, October 20, 2019.

Two Shot served his country as an E-4 in the US Navy and was a Vietnam Veteran. He also was a camp historian for the SCV and honorary member of the Mechanized Calvary, founding member of The Three Eagles MC, founding member of The Travelers MC, member of the VFW, one of the original organizers of "Trail of Tears" route through Scottsboro, member of the Patriot Guard, and lifetime member of the NRA.
