



Joy Page Airheart

April 10, 1925 - July 12, 2015

Joy Page Airheart passed away on July 12th, 2015. Graveside service will be held on Tuesday July 14th 10:30 am at Cedar Hill Cemetery.

She was born in Woodville, AL and her family moved to Scottsboro a year later where she lived the rest of her life. She was a lifelong member of The First United Methodist Church beginning in the second established church building in town located at the corner of Market and Willow Streets where the post office is presently located. She and her husband Gene were married in the next church building built on Scott Street at the corner of Laurel Street. She continued her active involvement in the church now established. In the 1970's, she along with member Elisabeth Collins, envisioned needlepoint paraments and kneelers for their church. These two ladies vision came to fruition in the labor of love of their work along with a few other parishioners. She also served her church in the mentoring and training of the young members as acolytes. She strongly felt the ministry of emphasizing to the younger members that worship be dedicated to the glory of God.

She was involved in the Jackson County and State of Alabama Democratic Women which involved campaigning for Jimmy Carter as a member of the Peanut Brigade. Her other interests involved music and the arts. She was a charter member of The Three Arts Club. She was a founding and long time member of The Three Arts Club/Scottsboro Education Foundation. Her name can also be located in the Soda Jerk Hall of Fame archives.

Joy was preceded in death by her husband Gene Douglas Airheart, parents

Coleman (Coley) Page and Berta McGahey Page, and brother Moody Page. She is survived by her daughter Page Airheart, son in law Michael Allen of Charleston SC and grandson Coleman Douglas Allen who affectionately referred to his grandmother as "J"
