“ Momma's Eulogy:

When pillars of society or pillars of the community pass away, people often talk about their “Legacy”. Today, I’m going to talk about the Legacy of our mother. Sitting in the seats today, is the evidence of her greatest legacy. In each of her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren....lies her legacy. The teachings that she gave us are the things that made us all who we are today. Whether we agreed with them at the time they were being instilled in us or not is a different matter. I think we would all agree that, in that tiny 5-foot woman, there was a fierce individual with a firm sense of what was right and what was not. She emulated for us how to be strong in the face of adversity. Starting with one of my earliest memories, a massive brain injury that most would not have survived, she did. She battled the people who told her what she “Should or shouldn’t do”, and told them what she WAS going to do. Defying everyone, she was there for Doug’s graduation day. She battled her way back, learning faces, life skills and returned to this family with all the fire that we know her for. As a breast cancer survivor, she taught me to fight with grace when she didn’t feel graceful. Living with chronic pain and bone disease, she taught us to be strong when we want to quit. When the possibility of that cancer recurring arose in her life, she was ready. Strong. Serene. When she was diagnosed with this disease that has taken her from us, it was the first time I ever saw my Momma SCARED. After one of her hospitalizations, she asked me about hospice care. After having a very frank and painful conversation, she said that she was ready. She knew that this was going to be “it”....that this was the thing that would take her life. She had questions. She wanted answers. And then, she was ready. She knew what she wanted and how she wanted it to go. And she trusted in us to make sure that it went that way.

Through the battles of economic struggle, she always made sure that we had what was important. When things were a hard, she displayed the genteel grace of a Southern woman. She was a lady. She raised us in such a way that we were allowed to develop our own personalities. We were raised to think for ourselves. The boys

were the best example of that. There is no doubt that our Momma had her hands full, but you were all raised with one thing underlying everything else. If you search your hearts, you'll know that it's true...we are blood. In this world, we were born to each other. When we were growing up, we defended each other...sometimes from each other. Make no mistake she was a lioness when she needed to be, and we all knew when we had reached the limit of her tolerance. But she allowed us to have our own thoughts and ideas, because children are people too. I was the afterthought. I was raised, you would say, spoiled. I would say protected. I was the princess. I knew from the first, that you would be there for me. Momma insisted on it. WE ARE BLOOD. I can't speak for you, but I know that, as I raised my children, I found more and more of our Momma spewing from my lips. I raised my children with the same premise.....YOU ARE BLOOD. Others will come and go in your life. You'll love, you'll fall, you'll get your heart broken, you'll get angry....but when that world threatens you.....you can always fall back on your blood. That's our Momma's legacy. Along with these things:

- Love....love with everything you have.
- When things are hard, love anyway.
- When things are hopeless, reach for your blood.
- When you want to scream, speak softly.
- A southern lady always has flowers growing in her yard and displayed on her table.
- Never pass up an opportunity to offer your guests a little something sweet to taste.
- Don't peek when you're baking.
- And laugh. Never miss the opportunity to laugh.
